

Finishing

Row 7: K1, K2tog, K4(5)

Row 8: Knit

Row 9: K2tog, remove marker leaving 4(5) un-worked sts on left-hand needle.

Cut working end approximately 6(7)" long and pull through the st just worked.

Unravel the un-worked 4(5) sts forming the fringe.

Knot fringe at base if desired.

This pattern can also be adapted to one strand of yarn, using any of these yarns: Primero, Duet, or Harmony. Change your needle size to a US #17 or 19 and knit away. The result is very lightweight, airy and open, an absolute delight to wear.

One word of caution, the pattern calls for knitting from one point of the triangle to the other, increasing until you are halfway and then decreasing. You will need to weigh your yarn and start your decrease when $\frac{1}{2}$ of the skein has been used to be sure to have enough to finish the shawl.

When doing the pattern with two strands of yarn, there will be enough yarn left over from the shawl to do a generous scarf as well. Have fun and knit away!
